Message from the Principal

Dear Families,

Happy June! The end of the year came more quickly than any of us expected. We had a jam-packed month of May! Students in the choir, band, and orchestra serenaded our community during the Spring Concert. Our first annual school-wide Career Day was a HUGE success thanks to our counselor Mr. Brogan and more than 30 parent and family volunteers. We cannot wait to grow this event next year. The talent of our K-8 students was showcased during our two daytime talent shows. Students danced, played instruments, told jokes, and sang.

Spirit Week brought an incredible amount of fun to CW Henry. The rain held out and we played a variety of organized games from 10am - 2pm on Field Day. A huge thank you to our gym teacher, Mr. Munter, as well as all of our classroom teachers, for their support on this day.

As announced earlier, our school building is undergoing exciting work this summer. We held two informational meetings for families on May 7th and May 16th to share information about the upcoming Capital projects. Beginning on June 10th, teams of contractors will begin working on the K-2 Classroom Modernization

project as well as the Paint and Plaster Stabilization Project. All building work is scheduled to finish up by August 9th. We look forward to welcoming everyone back to many fresh coats of paint and completely re-modernized rooms in our K, 1st, and 2nd grade classes.

Looking ahead to next year, we are very exciting to announce three new developments at C.W. Henry. With the support of the School District of Philadelphia, we are launching a restorative Youth Court with our rising 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students. With the guidance of CW Henry teachers, our Youth Court will be run by upper school students to address climate and culture concerns. We will also enter into a new partnership with the Office of Climate and Safety as we've been accepted to become a PBIS (Positive Behavior Support) school. Our staff will receive training, coaching, and resources as we develop our school-wide approach to positive behavior support. Last but not least, we will partner with Playworks to develop a sustainable recess program for all students. School Climate staff will receive coaching and support from a Playworks Site Coordinator. Stay tuned for more information!

We are wishing a very sad goodbye to the following staff members: Mrs. Greenhall, our School based Teacher Leader. Mr. Wright, our 6th and 7th grade

Spring Sports

Dragonboating:

Congrats to the Henry Dragonboating team and Mrs. Heberley (4th grade teacher) for competing in the Independence Regatta on June 1st! The Henry team placed 3rd overall-which was no easy feat as some of the competing teams were adult teams!

Softball:

The Henry softball team competed in 6 games this year against other Philadelphia school district middle schools, with a final record of 3-3. 12 out of 15 players were brand new this year! A big thank you to Ms. Cantarini (Social Studies) for coaching the team again this year! A shout out to Henry parents Mr. Watts and Mr. Blackwell for helping coach the team! The team also participated in the Youth Softball Celebration with the Phillies for our end of the season celebration.

Track:

The Henry Track & Field Team had a remarkable season with several achievements and records. We had a record

number of students rostered this year at 22! Our girls 4x100 team qualified for the Penn Relays for the third straight year. We finished 2nd at Roxborough Sectionals and qualified for the Philadelphia School League Championships for the first time. Some individual highlights include Ananda Grisson finishing in 1st place for the long jump at 14'5" and tied for 1st place in the 100-meter sprint at 12.9 seconds; Aeryka Laureano finishing in 3rd place for the 800 meter at 3:08 minutes; and our girls 4x100 team finishing tied for 3rd at 54.1 seconds, members included Makiyah Perry, Aniyah Lewis, Alaya Crawford and Ananda Grisson. Overall, the girls finished 7th and the boys finished 12th at the championships at Gratz Field. We'd like to thank and recognize our three year track members, Jeremiah Kensey and Makiyah Perry for a phenomenal middle school career at CW Henry. Thank you to all our student athletes for a memorable season!

Yearbook Club:

Upper School Spring Classroom Highlights

In Science class with Ms. Harley...

-Collaboration with art class- Students grew seedlings of marigold, Japanese indigo, and safflower (among others) in the classroom and then transferred them into a special school garden bed. These flowers will grow into plants that will be used in the fall to dye fabric for textile art with Mrs. Johnson, Henry art teacher. This was a project supported by Dr. Britton, school psychologist, and Mrs. Johnson.

-Also in science class- 7th and 8th graders worked with LEGO robotics this year. They got experience with coding to get our robots to move in different directions and had fun racing them down the hall. This project will continue next year.

In English Language Arts (ELA) with Mrs. Wirshup (6th/7th) or Ms. Raup (7th/8th)...

-Our middle school students participated in the Writer's Matters program this year through both ELA and History with Ms. Cantarini. *Writers Matter* is a program through LaSalle University where students learn critical writing skills through the use of journal writing as a vehicle for self-expression. Through writing about their lives, the students find an effective emotional outlet at a time in their lives when personal expression and having their voices heard is so important.

Students kept writer's notebooks and created pieces about themselves, their challenges, and their families. At the end of the year students wrote pieces titled "Reflections - What Do I See In the Mirror?" C.W. Henry had six students win prizes for their writing pieces!

-Students also participated in the city-wide African American Oratorical Contest. We chose to focus on African American Heros and Sheros. Students wrote about important African Americans and their impact. Two students were chosen to compete in the city-wide performance-a Henry student won honorable mention!

-The 6th grade participated in a year long intensive program with the Philadelphia Museum of Art. All students visited the Museum 6 times for lessons with education staff that fosters critical thinking and deep looking. Museum staff also visited the students at Henry for additional lessons.

In Social Studies class with Ms. Cantarini...

-Students also participated in the Writer's Matter program (see above in the ELA section for more info on the program)

- Students participated in *Do the Write Thing*, a school district sponsored city-wide writing contest, and 7th grade student Olivia Williams won an honorable mention award for her written submission about ending violence in Philadelphia. Way to go, Olivia!
